

EPR INVITATIONAL ENDURO

Al Blanchard's East Portland Raceway was the sight for the H.O.R.O.'s first ever team enduro. Tyco 440 X-2 cars were supplied by Al for the race. Each of the cars were fitted with silicone rear tires, and each car ran a Formula I type body. No other modifications were made to the cars. The race was scheduled to run for 3½ hours. Racing was broken down into 10 minute heats, with 1 minute between heats to allow teams to rotate drivers, and change lanes. During the first few changes between heats it appeared 1 minute would not be enough time. At the beginning of the race teams ran wild during the 1 minute lane changes accomplishing absolutely nothing! As the race progressed teams found themselves becoming more organized. By the end of the race, teams were changing pickup shoes, cleaning tires and shoes, and oiling their cars before the minute was up!

You know, the word ENDURO is really an inadequate word to describe the the type of racing we experienced at East Portland Raceway on March 17, 1985. The correct word is ENDURANCE! Yes, Endurance - a long, deliberate word. Not the abbreviated, prissy sounding version - enduro! After all a 3½ hour race is hardly abbreviated, and the intense competition was hardly prissy! Just ask Glenn Heath! During Glenn's 10 minute heats his nerves needle was pegged! I mean this guy was 5 grand over red line on his tension tach! Glenn was shaking so bad Al asked if he was mixing cement in his pockets!? Although Glenn was the most obvious shaker, I didn't hear of anybodies' pockets hardening! The 10 minute heats gave each driver a chance to settle down to some serious racing. Mike Sapiano ran an impressive heat with no crashes during the full 10 minutes. The Tyco cars held up very well. The cars ran the full 3½ hours without major problems. Pickup shoes were the only parts requiring replacement. For our first try at an endurance race, it went very well!! Thanks Al, it was a great time!!

H.O.R.O. POINT RACE NO. 7

The final race of H.O.R.O. 1985 Point Series was held in North Plains on Dick Beardsley's 77 foot road course. Racing began with the Group 5, T-Jet class. Kerrie Skinner jumped out front in the early part of the race. Dave Smith, Bart Currie, and Albert Watson followed Kerrie into the final. Kerrie's Ford GT was running well, but Kerrie could not hold off Dave and Bart in the final. Dave Smith let out all the stops to take the final win by just over a lap. Bart aced out Kerrie by just one tenth of a lap for second place. Kerrie was third and Albert was fourth, only two laps behind Kerrie.







ISSUES



The new layout features a front straight in excess of 18 feet! I had the opportunity to run on the new track, and I'll tell you I was impressed! The new layout is much faster and more exciting to race on! This track is READY for next season!!!


-BIG NEWS!!!!-

The H.O.R.O. Promotional track is FINISHED!!! The track was completed with the use of Aurora A/FX track. Lap length is 30 feet including two 6 foot straights. The layout was kept fairly simple as to not discourage first time racers. The track features turn aprons made of masonite with the infield done in sheet rock covered with grass type scenery. The track is bordered by a 3½ inch wood side board. The track was built with portability being the number one consideration. The track stand is held together with 8 bolts and wing nuts. The control panel slips over the side board and connects to the track by a quick disconnect electrical plug. The power supply connects to the control panel by a similar plug. The track is wired for the BSRT lap counter. The lap counter also connects by plug. With the use of long leads all the tracks electrical equipement can be set up away from the track out of the racers way. Every measure was taken to make the track as dependable and easy to set up as possible. This track is also RACE READY

-BIGGER NEWS!!!-

The H.O.R.O. has MONEY! That's right, \$\$\$\$!!! The H.O.R.O. Promotional track made It's debut at the Mustang Swap Meet in McMinnville on June 1st. The complete track set up time was less than 20 minutes! 25 cents was charged for each racer to run 2 minutes. Prizes were awarded each hour to the racer completing the most laps in 2 minutes of racing. A grand prize was also awarded at the end of the day for the most laps turned in 2 minutes.
